Please include a brief bio (50-100 words) and a photo, if possible, of yourself to know the face behind the story and build connections.



INOFO at Cresol and Agricord International Seminar

The Intercontinental Network of Organic Farmers Organisations (INOFO) participated in the Cresol and Agricord International Seminar in Francisco Beltrão/PR, an event on "Innovation in food systems and sustainable finance" that took place from the 5th to 7th of June 2024.

Cresol, the largest credit cooperative institution focused on family farming in Brazil, hosted this seminar, which welcomed participants from more than 30 countries, including farmers' organizations from Africa and Asia, global farmers' organizations such as INOFO, members of the OPLP – Organizations of Portuguese Speaking Countries, as well as representatives from the United Nations (UN), BID (Inter-American Development Bank) and government

representatives at federal and state level.

INOFO was represented by its Global Relationships Manager, Thales Bevilacqua Mendonça and its local member, the organic farmer organization – Ecovida PGS Network, with 10 participants representing more than 400 hundreds of families from our network, demonstrating our agroecological productive power.



The main issues debated during the panels were:

- ☐ Financing climate change adaptation and mitigation in agriculture;
- ☐ Transforming food systems for sustainable and resilient agriculture;
- ☐ Empowering Producer Organizations through innovation and local knowledge in agriculture.

Among many jackets and ties, we were present with our roots and agendas, highlighting our work, and we were invited to speak on a panel about the empowerment of producer organizations through innovation and local knowledge in agriculture.

The agroforestry organic farmer Thales Bevilacqua Mendonça had the opportunity to talk about how we organize ourselves through PGS, how it works and what are the benefits far beyond just organic certification, connecting the local level with a global organization, INOFO, which Ecovida is member.



We had very positive feedback and interest from the participants about PGS, which INOFO has a huge experience in. Our participation through strategic networks and organizations like World Rural Forum and Agroecology Coalition was highlighted there, giving a bigger impact and amplified voice for our members!

The construction is daily, the journey is long and winding, but we leave with the certainty that we are on the right track, working, defending and promoting Agroecology as a solution to a good part of the problems and challenges we face in food systems around the world.

OFAI Farmers Market and Conference at Biofach India Trade Fair



The Organic Farming Association of India (OFAI) has been at the forefront of promoting organic farming in the country for over two decades.

Their tireless efforts led to hosting of the Organic World Congress (OWC) of IFOAM Organics International in 2017 India with its first Farmers Track. Building on this success, OFAI negotiated with Nurenberg Messe (NM) to organize the Farmers Market and Farmers Conference at the Biofach India Trade Fair every year.

This year, the event took place on August 3-5, 2024, at the Noida Expo Center in Uttar Pradesh. Farmers Market provides a platform for small farmer groups from across India to come together, have exposure, network, and market their products at this internationally recognised Organic Trade fair. Thanks to the OFAI committee and NM organisers for their understandings that the organic farmer enterprises, startups, Farmer Producer Organisations (FPOs and FPCs) recognised under the -

Association get the stall space at a subsidised rate per square meter compared to the normal charge for the exhibitors. These limited stalls are allotted with priority for the members and then vetted organisations only.

This event is managed by the voluntary efforts by the OFAI Managing Committee from Gujarat with the leadership from Devesh Patel, who is a successful second-generation organic farmer and entrepreneur himself.

The Farmers Conference is planned on either of the three days. The organisers offer a platform to OFAI for organising the Farmers conference where farmers share experiences, knowledge, and best practices in organic farming.

This year's Farmer's Conference at Biofach India was on the third day where organic farmers and small enterprises shared their farm stories along with challenges they face in the current certification system.



This 8th OFAI Farmer's Conference at Biofach India was successful in the presence of KP Illiyas, President (OFAI), Dr Gagnesh Sharma, Director, National Centre for Organic and Natural Farming (NCONF), Ministry of Agriculture & Farmers Welfare (MoAFW), Government of India and Ravi Prasad, Executive Director IFOAM Organics International who stayed for the entire session taking notes of the Farmer and small enterprise stories from Kashmir, Rajasthan, Maharashtra, Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, Kerala, Tamil Nadu to Kerala.

The Farmers Market and Farmers Conference in Biofach India is the only Biofach event globally that provides a dedicated platform and subsidised stalls for Farmer Producer Organizations (FPOs) and Farmer Organizations (FOs) under OFAI to showcase their products and on-farm innovations, setting it apart from other Biofach events.



This unique focus on empowering small-scale farmers and celebrating their contributions to sustainable agriculture makes Biofach India a beacon of inclusivity for the enriching growth of the global organic movement.

We hope that INOFO in future could have similar Farmers Market in all Biofach events internationally.

INOFO Coordinator Carolin Möller played a vital role in ensuring that the workshop's objectives were met and that all activities were aligned with INOFO's vision.

The workshop was structured around several key objectives crucial for any organization aiming to have a global impact. Among the primary goals was teambuilding, which was approached through a series of interactive sessions designed to foster mutual respect and understanding among participants from diverse backgrounds.
